In today's second reading the Letter to the Hebrews says: "By virtue of that one single offering (his sacrifice on the Cross), Christ has achieved the eternal perfection of all whom he is sanctifying."

So ... has he achieved your eternal perfection? Are you perfect yet? No? Nor am I. So either you and I are not included among those Jesus is sanctifying (which would be rather depressing), or the Scriptures are wrong (which would be rather alarming), or there's a third alternative.

And the third alternative is that Jesus' one single offering is not *simply* an event in the past—over and done with one Friday afternoon in the spring of 33 AD. It *is* a historical event, but also something more. Jesus never loses his priesthood; he is a priest for ever, and he lives for ever to intercede for us with his Father (cf. Heb 7:21-25). So Jesus' sacrifice also endures for ever. That's what we mean by the sacrifice of the Mass. It's the very same sacrifice that Jesus offered once and for all on Good Friday afternoon, but seen in its eternal aspect; not receding further and further into history, but powerfully real and effective here and now for you and me.

That's why we offer the Mass for a particular intention. It is always offered for all the living and the dead, and always more especially for those who attend, but most particularly for some specific intention. This means that when Jesus died on the Cross for all of us, his intention was not just vague and general—love is never vague and general. He offers himself personally and particularly for each one of us and for our particular intentions. And throughout history he is achieving the eternal perfection of all whom he is sanctifying.

Of course, you can drop in any time the Blessed Sacrament is exposed without joining the rotas, but it would be wonderful if you could make that powerful commitment.*
