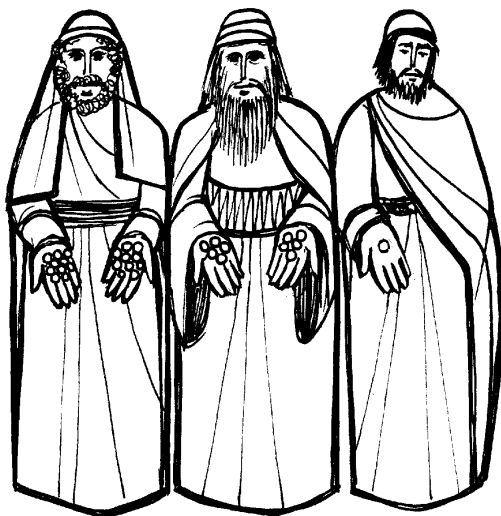

We don't usually comment on the Readings when preaching, but focus on the Gospel. However, today's First Reading comes at the end of Proverbs and I encourage all husbands to read it! Here is a picture of an exemplary mother and wife. She uses all her talents of mind and heart and faith in the service of her family and also of the poor. So, that neatly leads us to the Gospel and the parable of the talents. Jesus is challenging us (as always) to look at the rich gifts of faith that God has given each one of us. He challenges us by asking what have we done with them. Which one of the servants in the Gospel do we identify with? A talent has first of all to be discovered and recognised. It has been said that our true birthplace is the place in which we awaken to our gifts and talents. Often it takes an

outsider to recognise the talent. Then, what do we do with it? I am sure you agree that it is disheartening to see at times how people with a lot of potential simply refuse to use their gifts. It is by living that we develop our talents, and it is by using them that they grow. Every talent has to be developed. Sometimes a lot of hard work, discipline, and patience are required if a talent is to bear its full fruit. We see this in the example of the first two servants in Jesus' story. However, we see the opposite of it in the case of the third servant. It wasn't the harshness of his master that prevented him from using his talent - that was merely an excuse. Nor was it a lack of opportunity. He himself was to blame, through a combination of laziness, cowardice and selfishness. Life is God's gift to us. What we do with life is our gift to God.

If you wish, you can also include a donation, which will go towards the Holy Souls Masses celebrated throughout the year.
