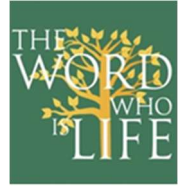

In the first *Epsom Deanery Newsletter* last Autumn, I wrote about the initial steps we were taking in response to Bishop Richard's *Call to Mission*, as we committed ourselves to putting his Pastoral Plan into effect in this area. In this issue, you can read about some of the meetings that have happened, some actions that are taking place in the coming weeks and months, and about plans that are beginning to form for the longer term; and, most importantly, about how each person can get involved.

But **before** you read on, let's take a moment to hear again from the Pastoral Letter Bishop Richard wrote for the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord: *the renewal of our parish structures is to enable us all – lay faithful, religious, deacons, priests and bishop – to take our proper place in the great Mission that the Lord has given to us...* It is Bishop Richard's hope and prayer that the renewal to which we are all called, and the willingness to find new ways of serving and witnessing, will help *communities join together in prayer, in formation and in the mission that will develop from these foundations.*

Prayer *"Prayer is the necessary foundation for every step that we take."*¹ To

this end, everyone is invited to a **monthly Holy Hour**, dedicated to praying for the Deanery and the Pastoral Plan; this is in addition to the opportunities for praying together that are already in place across the Deanery. The Hour will include a Scripture Reflection, the Holy Rosary and Benediction; Mass will follow at 6pm. It would be lovely to see people from across the Deanery coming together to pray! Also, this Lent, Bishop Richard is visiting each Deanery to celebrate Reconciliation Services and will be coming to the Epsom Deanery on **Tuesday 25th March, at 7pm, at St Michael's, Ashted**. At the Deanery Clergy Meeting in February, it was agreed that, as a sign of our working towards greater collaboration, this would replace all other Lenten Reconciliation Services. There are, of course, regular opportunities for Reconciliation in each community, and at the Deanery Retreat Days.

Formation *"Every person in the Diocese has the right and responsibility to grow in the knowledge and understanding of the faith."*² Formation is life-long and for everyone; it's about becoming more Christ-like.

Jesus says, *everyone when he is fully trained will be like his teacher [Luke 6:40]*. Each of us must ask: What formation or training do I need to be more like Christ the Teacher? What formation or training will help us help each other develop the gifts God has given us for the service of the Church and her mission? In this constant 'becoming' more like Christ, the Eucharist plays a central part: *grant that we, who are nourished by the Body and Blood of your Son and filled with his Holy Spirit, may become one body, one spirit in Christ [Eucharistic Prayer III]*. What a beautiful vision! But it doesn't happen automatically, only when we engage in the Mass with open-hearted generosity and a willingness to share in the sacrifice.

Mission *"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations."* [Mt.28:19] This is our Mission, to bring the good news of salvation to the whole world. As we progress together towards becoming a new single Parish, we must never lose sight of this purpose. Bishop Richard reminded us that, *in this Jubilee Year, the Holy Father has called us to be Pilgrims of Hope: our Hope is the Kingdom to which we look forward and our Mission is to make this Hope our gift to the world*. This Mission is for everyone and encompasses everything about the way we live our lives as Christians.

Reflecting on all this, there is much to do. I pray that each one of us will use this season of Lent to reflect on how we can best support these efforts, and I invite everyone to commit both prayers and practical support to the work that will be needed. Please get involved. Look out for opportunities listed in this newsletter or in your parish newsletters. I know some people are finding this a challenge – please feel free to use the mailbox address below to let me know directly about your concerns – but I look forward in hope as we continue our journey together.

Getting to know each other

Fr Rajesh Minz was ordained priest in 2008 for the Diocese of Rourkela, which is situated in the North East of India. After ordination Fr Raj served as an Assistant Parish Priest in his home diocese, where he helped establish a new school. After two and half years he moved to St. Albert's Theological Regional Major Seminary in Ranchi, India, where he had done his own theological studies. He taught theology there for two years before being sent to do further studies in Pastoral Theology at Leuven, Belgium.



With the agreement of his bishop, who wished him to have the experience of living and working abroad as a missionary, he has served in our Diocese since 2015, first in Bexhill, moving to Haslemere in September 2022 and serving as parish priest of Tadworth from September 2024. "I was born in Portsmouth. After making my FHC, I was asked to become an Altar Server and served the early morning daily Mass for the Dockyard Workers. A new Curate came to the Parish determined to teach me the Latin Mass responses. He was Fr Cormac Murphy O'Connor! He was also responsible for persuading my Father (a non-Catholic) to send me to St John's College founded by the De La Salle Brothers, rather than the non-Catholic Grammar School. We then moved to Maidstone and finally to Brighton where I met my wife to be, Jean.

Climbing the Corporate ladder with an Oil Company required a lot of house moves. Our three children were born in Sussex, Norfolk, and the West Midlands. There were also two assignments in Ireland, between which we moved to our current home in Great Bookham. My journey to the Diaconate started in Lourdes during the Diocesan Pilgrimage. After Formation at Seminary, I was Ordained in 2008 into the Parish of The Holy Spirit, Fetcham, later conjoined with Our Lady of Sorrows, Effingham. In 2010, the Bishop asked me to be the RC Chaplain at Gatwick Airport: I spent 10 memorable years in this dynamic and rewarding Ministry. I have been a member of the Bishop's Council of Deacons and am currently part of the mentoring team to assist the Diocesan Clergy. I praise God for this special Ministry, my marriage and my family."

Plans for our new Parish

Discussions have continued in our Deanery Clergy meetings: we are all aware of the challenges posed by the implementation of the Pastoral Plan, but our discussions have also been creative about the immediate opportunities to witness to greater collaboration; for instance, the Lent Retreat Days at Ladywell and Chilworth that were offered across the Deanery, our Lent Reconciliation Service to be celebrated together with the Bishop, and the 'Pulpit swaps', which are featured elsewhere in this newsletter. This is in addition to the steps being taken to work together, such as Banstead and Tadworth sharing preparation for Confirmation.

At the beginning of January, Administrators, Office Managers, and Secretaries from the Deanery came together to discuss the Pastoral Plan and explore opportunities for collaboration and mutual support. Represented were a great variety of times in post, from eight years to two weeks, so the simple fact of gathering together was appreciated. There was positive feeling about the Pastoral Plan, as these comments show.

"It appears much more achievable due to a more realistic approach. It's more about communities and coming together rather than everything closing down and stopping."

This group, too, acknowledged the time and challenges involved in 'developing the correct path to change', and made practical suggestions, such as advertising events across the area, sharing information about hall rentals, etc.

"There was a great feeling of mutual support, sharing of information, and a sense that everyone is doing a similar job i.e. we are not alone although we maybe in our respective parishes! Praying together with scripture was a lovely ending."

The Diocese has begun to investigate how a shared website might also serve the communities, giving people easier access to Mass times, and information about courses and activities. It was hoped that future meetings would continue the mutual support, but perhaps have more time to discuss things in greater detail.

In similar fashion to the gathering of this group, Chairs of Finance from the nine existing parishes will be invited to meet soon, to make and/or strengthen relationships, and to begin to reflect on the implications and opportunities in this area.

Creating a Parish Leadership Team

Writing to the clergy of the Diocese, Bishop Richard has asked for the creation of a Parish Leadership Team for each new parish. He writes: *In order to ensure the best possible communication and a collaborative approach to mission, each parish will develop a leadership team. This will be a small group of lay people and clergy who can unite around a shared vision for the parish. Each community will establish or develop their own representative team and some members from these teams will also be invited to form a parish-wide council which will meet frequently with the Leadership Team. How the Council and leadership teams are constituted is for local determination and guidance from the Formation team is available for this.*

We will therefore be forming a Parish Leadership Team, based on this mandate. It will have a mix of clergy and lay members, drawn from each of our nine existing parishes. Its task will be to develop a Vision for our new Parish and to draw up a local Plan ('roadmap') for moving towards it. As the work takes shape, we will be inviting everyone to get involved. We know that there are many questions that need to be addressed; we also know that we don't even know all the questions yet, let alone all the answers!

We will have the support of the Diocese as we progress and some Parishes in the Diocese are already further along this path than we are, so we will be able to learn from them as we take time to discern carefully, with the help of the Holy Spirit, the actions we should take. Over time, the role of the Parish Leadership Team will evolve into one focused on how to sustain and improve our ability to fulfil our Mission.

Working out how we can all most effectively work together to do this will need the support – and, especially, the prayers – of the whole Deanery. It will take time. Please get involved.

'What will this mean for me?'

We know people have questions about the practical implications for our local communities

Q: Is everything going to be centralised?

A: Absolutely not.

How different things will work needs to be worked through with the people who know about them. Whilst some things may be better 'done once'; many activities will remain rooted in our local communities, though they may still benefit from increased mutual engagement and support between them.

Q: Will the new Parish Leadership Team take all the decisions?

A: Absolutely not.

In line with the mandate from Bishop Richard (previous page), this team will be responsible for establishing a Vision and a local Plan for our Parish and then guiding how individual topics are addressed by the people who know about them.

Q: Will local communities keep their own parish finance arrangements?

A: We don't know yet.

There are many issues to be worked through with the experts we already have – our Parish Finance Committees. Some arrangements are likely to change, but, as a minimum, we will still need to be able (both under Canon Law and as a charity) to ring-fence funds given for specific purposes; and we need to get the right balance between supporting local community activities and enabling the new Parish to work collectively for our common good.

Q: When will we formally become a new Parish?

A: We don't know yet – or, to put it another way, 'when we're ready'.

Q: What will the new Parish be called?

A: We don't know yet.

Traditionally, naming is in the gift of the Bishop ...

Q: Will I still be able to attend Mass in my local church?

A: Yes.

The Bishop has no plans at the moment to reduce the number of places where Mass will be celebrated.

Q: Will the times of Masses change?

A: Not immediately.

We have no plans to make immediate changes to Mass times. Initially, we will see if we can improve the range of provision for Holy Days of Obligation; in due course, we will need to consider what changes to Mass times will be required so that we can support all our communities with a smaller number of priests.

Q: Will we stop having a priest who lives in our local community?

A: Sadly, for some parts of the Deanery, at some point over the next few years, the answer is likely to be 'yes' ...

We are currently blessed with ten serving Priests, three Permanent Deacons, one retired Priest and one retired Deacon, plus one Seminarian who – when not studying at the seminary – is based at Epsom and working towards priestly Ordination this summer.

But the harsh reality is that our Diocese does not have enough priests to sustain the 'old' model of 85 parishes, each with its own resident priest.

We pray that a reinvigorated, missionary church will generate more vocations, but a new seminarian committing themselves in 2025 will not be ordained priest until at least 2032. In the meantime, we cannot count on retiring priests being replaced and we must acknowledge that other communities may have more pressing needs than we do here.

As we build our New Parish, therefore, we need to make sure we design it so that we can support all of our communities with a smaller number of priests, aided by the skills, capabilities and commitment – and prayers – of all the Faithful.
